3RD REGIONAL CONFERENCE ON ALTERNATIVES November 11-13, 2021

"Advancing and Realizing Alternative Regionalism: Southeast Asian Peoples' Solidarity and Resistance in COVID-19 Times."

Background

The COVID-19 pandemic lays bare the structural inequality and the broken capitalist system in place in Southeast Asian countries. The malady underscores the moral bankruptcy of governments and its regional body, the Association of Southeast Asian Nation (ASEAN), to effectively respond to a global health emergency. Given the weak public health care systems, sub-standard health infrastructure, and the absence of universal social protection of the many poor and marginalized communities, the ineptitude of many of these state leaders is also further revealed by the COVID vaccine apartheid which continues to unfold within and across countries, perpetuated by the interests of big pharmaceutical companies and privatized healthcare systems.

As countries suffer the different variations of a lockdown, the pandemic has been weaponized by many authoritarian regimes to consolidate their power over their citizens and fortify their neo-liberal policies and programs. In other words, with the exponential rise of COVID-19 cases in the region with no hopes yet of flattening the curve, the creeping authoritarian tendencies of ASEAN leaders intensify in the midst of an alarming economic downturn. This shrinking of the democratic space is manifested in the Burmese military junta, the Thai junta, the Indonesian government's railroading of the passage of the Omnibus Law, the Philippine government's passing of the Anti-terror Law, and the Malaysian and Cambodian governments' increasing reliance on military powers to concentrate political and economic power, among others.

Nevertheless, these multiple crises also provided an opportunity for communities to demonstrate their cross-border solidarity, resistance, and collective action through their alternative practices. These grassroots communities actively chart a path towards an alternative mode of regional integration that embraces and privileges the principles of solidarity, social cohesion, cooperation, mutual benefit, and the commons principle.

This year, the 3^{ed} Regional Conference on Alternatives responds to the crises and opportunities brought about by the COVID-19 pandemic. Towards a people-centered, people-led post-COVID-19 Southeast Asia, the conference will gather diverse peoples from across the region and beyond to advance and realize an alternative regionalism rooted in the alternative practices and experiences of communities from below. A regional movement that is hoped to carry on the vision will discuss and plan strategic direction, drawing on the lessons from one another and from the global alternatives movements.

Objectives

Themed "Advancing and Realizing Alternative Regionalism: Southeast Asian Peoples' Solidarity and Resistance in COVID-19 Times," the conference aims to meet the following objectives:

- 1. To identify concrete steps/action points towards a regional movement of alternatives
- 2. To highlight peoples' alternatives that withstood and developed amidst the COVID-19 pandemic and their critical responses to the situation
- 3. To harness and consolidate people-to-people and cross-border solidarity through diverse platforms of engagement
- 4. To strengthen networks and explore new linkages towards a global alternatives movement
